# SCHEDULE A - PLAYER BENEFITS

#### OFF ICE TRAINING MEMBERSHIPS

All players shall receive a training membership during the hockey season. Teams may provide on-site training equipment similar if their home facility is so equipped.

## BILLETING/TEAM COMMUTING MAXIMUMS

Players living over 80km from their home arena shall not be required to commute to games and practices. These players must be offered a billet in the community where the team plays, either at the teams' expense or amount per month specified in the agreement if the player is covering the expense. The team shall be responsible to arrange the billeting in either case.

## **TEAM TRAVEL MINIMUMS**

Teams travelling over 80 km one way for a game are required to provide transportation to the game for any player who lives in the home community, or on the opposite side of the route taken to the game, and along the route to the game. Notwithstanding this policy, teams must be mindful of the distance travelled to the home arena to board the bus. No player shall be required to drive in

excess of 80km to participate in a league game. All players travelling over 80 km shall be provided an appropriate post event meal.

### **PRACTICE TIMES**

Teams shall provide at least 3 practices per week in the case of weeks where 3 or fewer league games are scheduled. A minimum of 4.5 hours of weekly ice time shall be provided to all players.

#### VIDEO ANALYTIC SYSTEM AND PLAYER PROFILES

Players receive video shift clips after each game, the opportunity to utilize the platform to upload videos and maintain their profile and includes athletic and academic information and advanced video capability.

#### **CCHL SHOWCASE EVENTS**

The CCHL is the original host of league showcases and will be enhancing the event with an expanded schedule this season. Over 200 NHL, NCAA and CHL organizations attend the event each year.

## **BASELINE CONCUSSION TESTING**

All teams conduct baseline testing prior to the season and provide full rehabilitation from concussion and management of the information allows the player to ensure full recovery in a safe and professional manner.

## ACADEMIC PROGRAM - PAPER.COM TUTORING

Under the direction of the CCHL Academic Advisor, on registration all players are enrolled in 24/7 on-line tutoring access for the entire academic year. Team advisors will prepare the student for profile creation and offer course tutoring, problem solving, pre-grading of papers, SAT preparatory and pre-test preparatory sessions.

#### CCM EQUIPMENT PROGRAM

Skaters receive six sticks, helmet, visor, gloves and pants with preferred pricing on skates. Goaltenders receive four sticks, custom pads, blocker and catcher and goal pants.
